

# **RABBI'S** MESSAGE



Recently, a story caught my attention.

The restaurant chain Cracker Barrel decided to change its logo. Like so many companies today, they wanted to be more modern and "with the times." So, they retired their long-time icon, Uncle Herschel.

The change sparked an uproar. Customers who had grown up with the brand and felt attached to its southern style were furious. They felt the company was erasing its very identity.

And then Cracker Barrel did something remarkable. They admitted their mistake. They swallowed their pride, reversed course, and brought Uncle Herschel back.

Now, the truth is, I couldn't care less about Cracker Barrel (or their logo)—especially since it isn't kosher. Honestly, until this week, I had no idea their mascot was a nice old Jew called Uncle Herschell

So many Jews today feel the need and the pressure to modernize-to update, to make our traditions seem more "palatable" or "relevant." We try to fit in, to rebrand, to make Judaism look less like good old Uncle Herschel and more like the latest cultural trend.

But the secret to Jewish survival has never been rebranding. It's not pretending the world hasn't changed, but remembering that what makes us strong hasn't changed. Our soul is eternal. Our traditions are timeless.

As Cracker Barrel discovered this week, people value authenticity. They want something real. The Jewish strength that has carried us for thousands of years is not in marketing-it's in our roots. The nations of the world won't respect us because we hired a PR consultant to polish our image. They will respect us when we respect ourselves-when we live proudly as Jews and stay loyal to our heritage.

We have the Torah as our eternal logo. We have the same G-d who has always been with us, and always will Of course, it's not always easy to resist the pull to modernize, to blend in. But when we pause and remember where we come from—and who we truly are —that temptation quickly fades.

What impressed me most in this story was how the CEO responded to the backlash. She wrote. "We said we would listen, and we have." She didn't double down and get defensive. She admitted the mistake and recognized the criticism.

That's not easy. Nobody enjoys being told they've messed up. Our instinct is to defend, explain, or protect our pride.

We are now in the Jewish month of Elul. A month of reflection and a season to draw closer to G-d as Rosh Hashana approaches. A chance to ensure we haven't strayed and to return to our inner core, to our eternal roots. A time to say, "We listened, and we returned."

Let's not forget our own "Uncle Herschel," our own Bubby and Zaidy. They prayed, they lit candles, they ate kosher, and they did everything they could to support Jewish causes. There was nothing more important to them than celebrating the holidays together. Their Judaism was real.

That's our inheritance. That's our strength.

What sustains us is not chasing what's fashionable, but holding on to what is eternal.

The Torah will always be our logo. Our ancestors will always be our role models. And by staying true to our roots, we will thrive into the future.

### WHAT ARE THE HIGH HOLY DAYS?

If the year is a train, the High Holidays are its engine. A blend of joy and solemnity, feasting and fasting, prayer and inspiration—all make up the spiritually charged head of the Jewish year.

### ROSH HASHANA

Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the universe, the day G-d created Adam and Eve. It's celebrated as the "Rosh," or head, of the Jewish year. Just as the head controls the body, our actions on Rosh Hashanah have a tremendous impact on the rest of the year.

As we read in the prayers, on this day "all inhabitants of the world pass before G-d like a flock of sheep," and it is decreed in the heavenly court "who shall live and who shall die... who shall be impoverished and who shall be enriched; who shall fall and who shall rise."

It is a day of prayer, a time to ask the Almighty to grant us a year of peace, prosperity, and blessing. But it is also a joyous day, when we proclaim G-d King of the Universe. The blowing of the Shofar represents the trumpet blast sounded at a king's coronation. Its deafening cry also serves as a call to repentance and a renewed commitment to return to Hashem.

### YOM KIPPUR

Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, is the holiest day of the year-when we are closest to G-d and to the essence of our souls. As the verse states: "For on this day He will forgive you, to purify you, that you be cleansed from all your sins before G-d."

Over 3,000 years ago, this was the day G-d forgave the Jewish people at Sinai for the sin of the golden calf. On Yom Kippur, we set aside physical needs and afflict ourselves by refraining from eating or drinking, wearing leather shoes, washing, or bathing.

### SUKKOT & SIMCHAT TORAH

Following the solemn High Holidays, these festivals are a time of unbridled joy. Sukkot is a weeklong holiday that celebrates the gathering of the harvest and commemorates the miraculous protection G-d provided for the Children of Israel when they left Egypt.

We celebrate by dwelling in a foliage-covered hut (a Sukkah) and by shaking the Lulav—the "Four Kinds" of palm, myrtle, willow, and citron. This serves as an expression of both our diversity and our unity.

The joy of this season reaches its peak on Simchat Torah, when we celebrate the conclusion—and immediate restart—of the annual Torah-reading cycle. We mark it with Hakafot (dancing in circles with the Torah) and a festive meal—plus a l'chaim or two!
